Health Tip

Chewing gum makes you more alert. If you're suffering from a mid-afternoon slump or can't seem to concentrate in the morning, then try chewing some gum to make you feel awake. Coventry University researchers found that chewing mint flavored gum dramatically reduced feelings of tiredness. Another study on the subject found that chewing gum can improve memory by 35 percent, relieve stress and reduce anxiety levels. Clinical studies have shown that chewing sugarless gum for 20 minutes following meals can help prevent tooth decay. This can be a good preventive measure in situations when tooth brushing and flossing aren't practical, but sugar-free or not, chewing gum should never replace good dental hygiene practices.
