
A back to school supply drive is one way that we can help fill that need, but there are additional ways that we can provide ongoing support.

The Holocaust was the systematic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of six million Jews by the Nazi regime and its allies and collaborators. By studying the Holocaust, we learn the importance of speaking out against bigotry and indifference, promoting equity, and taking action.

Just because a dark chapter in our history took place many years ago does not mean that we should stop learning about it, and from it.

Join us in August for a four-part lecture series designed to increase our understanding of the many complexities of the Holocaust.

About the presenter: Nancy Pettus' 25-Holocaust involvement with vear education has provided opportunities to reach countless students during her 30year teaching career, and educate teachers through local and national presentations. A 2005 Museum Teacher Fellow, her association with the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C. enriches her involvement with area teachers and through Holocaust-related schools events throughout the state.
