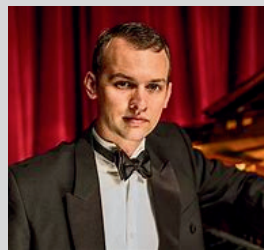
Janet Rutland and John Wooley Celebrate Henry Mancini's 100th Birthday

The sovereignty they had known over the land was now subject to being divided up and given, traded or sold specifically to white citizens of the State. The laws further focused on the removal of the Cherokee Nation and other First Americans altogether from the lands of Georgia." - *Trials That Shaped American*.

David Goldenberg, Professor of Business and newly appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Tulsa Historical Society, will discuss the 1832 court case *Worcester v. Georgia* and how it affected the sovereignty of the Cherokee Nation and began the *Trail of Tears*.

One new exhibit is dedicated to the story of 42 members of the young Israeli Air Force who came to the Spartan College of Aviation and Technology in Tulsa for a nine-month training program. They were known as the "Spartan Boys". They were "adopted" by families of the Tulsa Jewish community during their time in Tulsa. Upon completion of their training, they returned to Israel as certified aircraft mechanics. One young Polish mechanic, Bob Golan (of blessed memory), ended up moving to Tulsa and becoming a docent at The Sherwin Miller Museum of Jewish Art and a resident of Zarrow Pointe Retirement Center.
