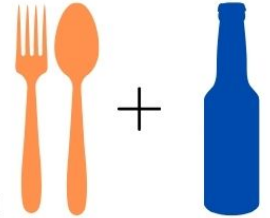

He is credited with owning Tulsa's first store, marking off the first street, organizing its first school system, it's first church, and its first civil government. He saw the city grow from a collection of tents to over 150,000 people.

Live Music: Rick Clemons

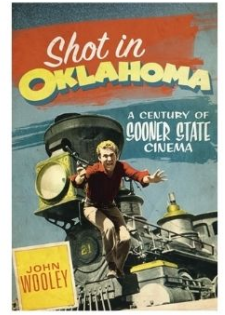
