Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year, begins at sundown on the first day of Tishrei, the seventh month of the Hebrew calendar. Rosh Hashanah commemorates the creation of the world and marks the beginning of the Days of Awe. It is a ten-day period of introspection and repentance that culminates with Yom Kippur.

The holiest day on the Jewish calendar, when Jews fast, pray, seek forgiveness from G-d and fellow men, and come closer to G-d, Yom Kippur is also known as The Day of Atonement.

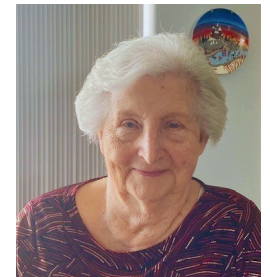
